Please note the following conditions of approval:

- 1. The Principal Investigator (PI) will immediately report anything which might warrant review of ethical approval of the project in the specified format, including:
 - a. Unforeseen events that might affect continued ethical acceptability of the project. Serious Adverse Events must be notified to the Committee as soon as possible. In addition, the PI must provide a summary of the adverse events, in the specified format, including a comment as to suspected causality and whether changes are required to the Patient Information and Consent Form. - 4. Proposed amendments to the research project which may affect both the ethical acceptability and site suitability of the project must be submitted firstly to HREC for review and, once HREC approval has been granted, then submitted to the REGO.

- 5. Amendments which do not affect either the ethical acceptability or site acceptability of the project (e.g., typographical errors) should be submitted via ERM to the HREC Coordinator. These should include a cover letter from the PI providing a brief description and rationale for the changes and accompanied by all relevant updated documents with tracked changes.
- 6. The HREC will be notified, giving reasons, if the project is discontinued at a site before the expected date of completion.
- 7. The PI will provide an annual report to the HREC by 30th April each year and a final report at completion of the study in the specified format.
- 8. The District administration and the HREC may inquire into the conduct of any research or purported research, whether approved or not and regardless of the source of funding, being conducted on hospital premises or claiming any association with the Hospital; or which the Committee has approved if conducted outside Darling Downs Health.
